MORE THAN 3,000 D.C. METRO AREA RESIDENTS EXPECTED TO HELP CLEAN UP THE ANACOSTIA RIVER!

THE ANACOSTIA WATERSHED SOCIETY AND SEAFARERS YACHT CLUB WILL HOST THE 15TH ANNUAL ANACOSTIA RIVER CLEANUP AND EARTH DAY CELEBRATION ON APRIL 18, 2009. VOLUNTEER TODAY!

Bladensburg, MD—On April 18, 2009, the Anacostia Watershed Society (AWS), Seafarers Yacht Club, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, EarthShare, and more than 50 other sponsor and partner organizations will celebrate Earth Day 2009 by removing tons of trash and floating debris from more than 30 public cleanup sites throughout Maryland and the District of Columbia. Each year, water from rain and snow storms push upwards of 20,000 tons of trash and debris off sidewalks, streets, and parking lots into the Anacostia River. Since 1994, AWS and Seafarers have lead this massive community cleanup to draw public attention to the Anacostia's many pollution problems and remove as much litter as possible from both water and shoreline. This year, AWS representatives expect more than 3,000 D.C. metro area residents and visitors to volunteer for the effort. - **Northeast Branch Stream Valley Park off Taylor Rd. in Riverdale, MD**
- **Indian Creek at 5050 Powder Mill Rd. in Beltsville, MD**
- **Long Branch Park, 8700 Piney Branch Rd., Silver Spring, MD**
- **Matthew Henson State Park, at corner of May and Munsey Sts., Silver Spring, MD**

In addition to the recognition received for their participation, each cleanup volunteer will receive a free tote bag (while supplies last) and an invitation to attend a two hour Earth Day Celebration picnic at Bladensburg Waterfront Park at 4601 Annapolis Rd. in Bladensburg, MD. The celebration will feature free food, entertainment by the band Never In Denver, environmental exhibits, an awards ceremony, and an opportunity to speak with local elected officials about environmental concerns. This year's Earth Day tote bag features winning art and poetry submission from local school students entered in the Anacostia Watershed Society's annual River of Words Competition. More than 100 area students submitted works inspired by the Anacostia and their experiences on the water back in January 2009. The top three winners in the category of art and the category of poetry will receive cash prizes during the awards ceremony on the 18th.
