Community Cost Savings: Increases stormwater retention, reduces the need to expand regional water infrastructure, manages greenhouse and ozone emissions.

Improved Air Quality: Filters airborne particulates, produces oxygen, increases efficiency of building temperature regulation, and reduces the Heat Island Effect.

Better Stormwater Management: Increases stormwater retention and filtration and decreases the volume of stormwater entering local waterways.

Social Benefits: Creates a better-looking neighborhood, increases recreational opportunities, adds habitat for wildlife, and offers potential for local food production.
