Master Watershed Stewards work with their communities to:

Assess Watersheds- identify pollutant sources and create strategies for reducing these pollutants.

Educate Communities- help neighbors understand the most pressing environmental problems in their area.

Reduce Pollutants- work with communities to target pollution sources such as pet waste, fertilizer, or pesticides.

Coordinate Action- help communities reduce the polluted runoff by coordinating the installation of rain gardens, rain barrels, and other techniques.

Applications are open until class is full. Tuition is \$75 – scholarships available.
